Deputy Library Director of Operations Jenny Choi on behalf of San José Public Library’s City Librarian, Jill Bourne shared that Between June 1 and July 31, nearly **10,600** residents registered for this year’s Summer Learning program, with more than **3,760** people completing the overall challenge of logging at least 8 hours or 8 books read. Readers this year logged more than **112,000** total titles and almost **3 million** total minutes read. The 16th Annual Graphic Novel Making Contest (GNMC) held from June 1st-July 31st ended with 194 entries submitted from 200 participants, an increase of 14% compared to last year. Entries were judged by SJPL staff and local artists. Winners will be announced at this year’s GNMC Awards Ceremony, on Saturday, September 7th from 2-4PM at the City Hall Rotunda. 
A. Announcements & Meetings Attended by Commissioners as Commissioners:
